Dear Mullins Family:

I've been incredibly fortunate to serve Mullins UMC these past ten years alongside wonderful clergy, staff, lay leadership, and



the whole congregation. It's a church full of love and service to others. As some of you have recently heard, a new opportunity has come my way to join the staff of Germantown

Church starting in January 2024. I shared this news mid-September with Tom Machen and Pastor Russell, followed by the SPRC and the Chancel/Handbell choirs. Because we work closely together in the church's music ministry, I wanted them to hear this update from me before hearing it elsewhere. I wish it had been possible to tell everyone individually, but since it is not, I'm writing here.

Many of you have been a meaningful part of my life in some way: as spiritual mentors, friends, music makers, and as fellow disciples aiming to make our community better. I'm inspired by how Mullins works together and gives back to others in Christian love, regardless of individual differences. From Deborah Suddarth to Russell Morrow, I've gleaned wisdom from every minister with whom I've served. In Tom Machen, I have had a colleague who shares values of musical integrity and thoughtful service planning. I'm grateful to have played for his amazing vocals and expert choir directing. It has been a recent joy to have Carolyn Childs join me in the early service and to

get to know her. I'll cherish the memories made with the Chancel Choir, Mullins Ringers, and various musicians and friends who I invited to present special music with me over the years. I'm thankful for Aaron Foster, who introduced me to Mullins and invited me to play for him long before I knew I'd be returning to Memphis. This is a place where I've been able to grow along with you. As Pastor Russell says, every round goes higher and higher. I was not searching for a new position, and I accepted Germantown UMC's invitation only after a significant period of prayer and reflection. At GUMC, I'll have access to expanded ministry resources in the areas of piano. organ, chimes/bells, and personnel. I'll be working alongside a fine staff whose approach to ministry I respect, and who felt, along with their retiring organist/pianist, that I was the right fit for their team and vision.

They also respected my desire to not leave Mullins in a time-pressed situation before the autumn choir season and Advent prep (I declined their first invitation in June because they needed a September start date). In my new role, I can continue serving part-time in church music ministry while maintaining my other educational and performance-related work in the region.

My last Sunday at Mullins will be on Christmas Eve. I let Pastor Russell, Tom, and SPRC know I'm willing to use my community resources to help with transitions this winter, to whatever degree they feel it is appropriate. I know Mullins will continue to live into its mission statement and make positive impacts from the corner of Walnut Grove and Mendenhall and beyond. I'm truly blessed to have been a small part of that 178-year legacy. We will stay in touch! Meanwhile, I'll see you for several more Sundays.
