Dear Church Family,

Thank you for your prayers and support during my Clergy Renewal Leave, and to Rev. Camille Bradley for standing in the gap during my absence along with Pat, David, Tondala, Renee, and Louis who brought the messages each week with Camille.

Isaiah 43:18-19 (NIV) reminds us:

"Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland."

This season of renewal has been a profoundly meaningful and significant part of my journey toward eternal life. It was both necessary and timely, truly worth the time and effort invested. During this journey, I had the blessing of traveling across the country, touching three oceans, visiting every church I have pastored across four states over the course of 44 years of ministry, and visiting historical Black colleges and universities, including my alma mater, Wilberforce University. Along the way, I spent time with family and friends, and I was able to attend the funeral of a mentor who had helped shape my journey nearly 38 years ago. I had not seen him in over twenty years, yet his influence was still present in my life.

Throughout this pilgrimage, I encountered what I can only describe as God winks, divine moments where brief conversations, unexpected encounters, and unusual experiences revealed God's presence in ways that might not make sense to others but spoke deeply to me. Most importantly, I was able to rest, be still, commune with God, and listen intently for His voice. This time allowed me to write and clear what I have

often described as the "traffic Jam" of life—those lingering and stagnant places that needed clarity and renewal. I experienced joy and sorrow, rest and release, memory and vision, all as gifts of grace, reminding me that God continues to shape, guide, and carry me forward. My journey was in no way like that of Ebenezer Scrooge (thank God, LOL), but it was just as enlightening. Truly, God's grace is sufficient.

It is good for each of us to take time to reflect on our journeys. For me, I celebrate the strong, though not perfect, moral foundation I received at home with my family, extended through the church, and reinforced by the community of faith that nurtured my sisters and me. As I continue forward with my family, our church family, and my life's call and purpose, I carry with me two key takeaways from this season:

- 1. Isaiah 43:18–19 has real application in my life. God has indeed been doing a new thing through the seasons of my life, even when I did not fully realize it at the time.
- 2. The Lord's Prayer is a prayer of thanksgiving. Every phrase is an acknowledgment of God's grace and mercy. Try praying it this way: "Our Father, I thank You that You are..."—and let gratitude shape the way you pray.

As we move through the remainder of this conference year, let us continue to be mindful of the work we have begun, stay focused on what we have identified as our priorities, and, prayerfully in unity with Christ Jesus, face the challenges before us with grace, truth, and love. Together, we will complete the work we began in 2022.

World Communion Sunday is Oct. 5. This year we want to bring our global remembrance into focus by highlighting a specific area, namely Sichebeya,


Zambia. The table may look a little different, the bread may taste a little different, but together we are one in His body and blood.


